IN COMPLIANCE WITH NEP- 2020, THE GAUHATI UNIVERSITY RESTRUCTURED BA CURRICULUM AS FYUGP (FOUR YEAR UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMME)

The following are the outlines of FYUGP

1. Up to Third Semester all need to take three core subjects called minors, in semester IV a students can take major in one of the three minors.
2. If a student wants to leave after one year, he/she will be awarded a "Certificate" if he completes a four week vocational course during Summer Term (June)
3. A student can also exit after two years and will be awarded a "Diploma" if he completes a four week vocational course during Summer Term (June)
4. If a student completes three years he will be awarded degree (BA) with major or minor.
5. If a student completes four years he will be awarded Degree (Honours) or Degree (Honours with Research).

Admission will be open to all eligible candidates whose names are published in the merit list prepared by the College.

About Identity Card:

Identity Card will be issued as per SAMARTH portal.

* This is mandatory for all students to issue the Identity Card from the College authority.

Eligibility for Admission to the Honours Subjects

- ◆ Honours will be offered as per general merit list prepared by the college and on “First come First Serve” basis.
- ◆ Selection to the Honours courses will be approved by the concerned department on the day of admission subject to the availability of seat but however, the student must secure not less than 50% in the subject opted for honours and 50% aggregate in HS final (10+2) Exam.

- ◆ Admission will be on merit basis.
- ◆ Quota system will be maintained as per Govt. Norms for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC/ Differently Abled in admission. In case of unavailability of applicants of the said categories, the Quota will be open to all eligible candidates.

DOCUMENTS FOR ADMISSION

Admission forms must be submitted with following supporting particulars.

1. Xerox copies of Admit card and Mark sheet and **Testimonial certificate** of H.S.L.C. Exam.
2. Xerox copies of **Mark sheet, Testimonial and Registration** certificate of H. S. Exam.
3. **Gap certificate** from a competent authority, if applicable.
4. **Certificate** for SC / ST / OBC / MOBC / EWS.
5. **Ration Card** is compulsory for fee waiver student. However, only in case the students or their parents do not possess a Ration Card then **Income Certificate** can be produced.
6. Xerox copies of **Adhaar Card and Bank Passbook**.
6. Recent Passport size **Photograph** (two copies).
7. Recent a Full size photograph with **Plantation of a Tree**.
8. Students of other universities shall have to produce the **migration certificate** at the time of admission.



RULES AND REGULATION OF THE COLLEGE

- All the students will have to pay Admission Fees and other fees at a time on the day of admission.
- Students shall have to abide by the Rules and Regulations framed by the College Authority.
- Wearing College Uniform for student is mandatory during College hours (Classes, Examinations, College Week, Students' Union Election, Freshmen Social, Seminar, Workshop, Independence Day, Republic Day etc.)
- Use of mobile phone inside the College Premise is strictly prohibited.
- Students damaging College properties playing truancy and loitering hither and thither shall seriously be dealt with in order to maintain healthy academic atmosphere in the Campus.
- Students shall not be allowed to park their bicycles, bikes or cars outside the parking shed of the College.
- All have to contribute to tobacco free ensure pollution-free atmosphere in the Campus.
- Moral values and civil behaviour are honoured above all by the students of the College.
- Utmost importance is given on maintenance of discipline students violating the rules and regulations of the college and indulging in indiscipline are severely dealt and may even confiscate their admission.
- In case of any loss of the identity cards the students will have to report to the authority and procure a duplicate copy on payment of Rs. 100/- (one hundred)
- Intoxicating drinks are strictly prohibited in the College campus.
- In case of absence in classes, students should maintain 'Students leave record book', 75% attendance for every student is must, for less than that students should pay fine overall attendance at the ends of academic year (period) should be minimum 60%. Any students failing to maintain it will be liable to be Dis-Collegiate.
- For all disputes the decision of the College authority is final binding to all.
- The college authority may amend the rules and regulations as and when felt necessary.
- Students must not to be involved in active political activity in the College campus.
- Students' Union Election will be held according to guideline of the University.
- If any student claim or complain for ragging the remarkable or distinguished student he may turn out from the College.



Grading System

A) Conversion of marks to grades:

Actual marks secured by a group of candidates are converted into Relative Percentile (R) before conversion into Relative Letter Grades. The maximum Actual marks (i.e. Highest Mark)

(M) Secured in particular Group is converted into 100% and other actual marks (A) secured by the students of the same groups are converted to the Relative Percentile. $R = (100/M) \times A$ where R = Relative percentile.

M=Maximum (Highest) marks in the class.

A=Actual marks of a student who passed i.e., if the actual marks is not less than 30%.

ATTENDANCE AND CANCELLATION OF STUDENTSHIP

- Students must be regular and punctual attending their classes. As per the rules of G.U. students must have at least 75% attendance in their classes.
- In semester system there is no provision of non-collegiate and a student will lose his/her studentship if attendance is below 75%. It is also mentioned that a student failing to attend classes for thirty days at a stretch his/her admission shall be cancelled.

LIBRARY

- a) Students can enjoy the benefit of library services of the college by borrowing books from the college library as per rules.
- b) The Library remains open from 9 a.m. on all working days.
- c) To every students of the college library card is issued from the library on the basis of which he / she can borrow books.

ALLOCATION OF INTERNAL ASSESSMENT MARK OF CORE & COMMON SUBJECT UNDER NEP FOR 1ST SEM

As per NEP instruction 1(one) credit = 25 marks :-

In general, all core subjects (both major & minor) are comprised 4 credits that mean: $4 \times 25 = 100$.

Here 60% marks allocated for External exam. (Theory exam) & 40% marks allocated for internal assessment (Evaluation)

In this connection 40 marks are allotted as follows:-

Quiz or seminar = 6 Total = 20 (50% of 40 marks)

Group discussion = 4

Attendance = 4

Sessional exam = 20 (50% of 40 marks)

Grand Total = 40 marks.

This calculation is applied for core subject (comprising 100 marks)

Out of 75 marks - 45 marks (60% of 75) external exam. & 30 marks (40% of 75) Internal marks

Internal 30 marks allotted as follows:-

Home assignment = 6

Quiz or seminar = 6

Group discussion = 4

Attendance = 4

Total = 20

Sessional exam = 10

Grand Total = 30 marks is internal
